Letter from the President

December 12, 2011

Dear NCAFA members,

Welcome to the 2011 annual meeting of the Newaygo County Agricultural Fair Association. It has been my pleasure to serve you as the president of this association promoting agriculture in Newaygo County. The State of Michigan and our region suffered another year of economic challenges, which again required our board to become diligent in the day to day operations of the organization. Even with the challenges that we were faced with the organization continued to grow, in participation and support. I would like to highlight some of the happenings throughout the year. We started the fall with winter storage slightly down from previous years. In the spring we were able to host the MIHA middle school equestrian meets, which draw participants from the whole region. We were able to be the venue for the Ag Rescue training program put on by Newaygo County Emergency Planning. In April / May we received national notoriety in the country magazine. We continued to have a strong showing of summer activities, from clinics to camps to hosting Arnolds Amusements during Gerber Festival. We continued to work with the city of Fremont reviewing codes and requirements for a new entrance with fence on the east side of the property. We are on track to have this project completed in 2012. We had great weather for the week of fair until Friday night, at which time the rain began, with the amount of rain that we received we were forced to cancel our Saturday night event of motor cross, with a pass through on payment, deferring until the 2012 fair we did not have additional expenses. The week of fair over all was a success for all that attended. We had improvements made on the grounds through the generous donations from individuals, groups, clubs and companies. A few of the highlights were the addition of concrete to the west end of the market barn, a rest area, and improvements to the dump station. In the horse division the back announcers was externally improved with widows, siding, porch, and a steel roof. Grounds and beautification continued to maintain flower beds and construction of a new box near the horse arenas, along with organization for the club tack areas for the small animal and horse area by moving into 10x10 tents. We partnered with the "Arts Place" to promote the fair all summer long through a door painting project. Post fair we were blessed with the opportunity to have United Way choose to help our organization with a day of caring. This was coordinated by Mayor Jim Rynberg from the City of Fremont who coordinated the help from DML construction, the city of Fremont, the building trade's vocational students, Fremont Rent-All, and many volunteers. During this day the grounds underwent a total transformation, many areas still soiled from fair were cleaned and picked up, the information booth was closed in and painted, a long section of the west fence was cleared of brush, wash outs were filed, roof repairs, and painting galore across the grounds. The organization received the "community action award" for 2010 from the Fremont Chamber of Commerce; this is a high award that was given for the revitalization of the fair and the grounds. One of the big highlights was the addition of the semi, complete with vinyl graphics from "Power Graphics" this allows us to promote the fair throughout the county in many festivals and parades. With the help of Dave Westenfelder and his team of volunteers we participated in the Hay Art during the harvest festival in Oct. with a fantastic display of a giant teddy bear and honey pot. In the fall we were able to max out our space for winter storage. We also submitted and received a grant from Amazing X Foundation for adding concrete to the grounds increasing the accessibility for those with special needs. Over all we have had another great year. Our financial status remains intact with a yearend roll up of over \$201,400.00, with a second quarter endowment total of \$57,660.00 leaving a withdrawal amount of 14,904.00 if needed. I appreciate everything that everyone does to keep this organization moving forward, and look forward to the coming years. I know that the Newaygo County Fair will continue to be the pride and showcase of agriculture within the county, helping youth and the community to learn more about agriculture.

BYLAWS FOR THE NEWAYGO COUNTY AGRICULTURAL FAIR ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE 1

SECTION 1

The name of this organization shall be the Newaygo County Agricultural Fair Association.

SECTION 2

The mission of this organization is to provide educational experiences and entertainment for the public and Fair participants, promoting the area's agriculture and youth. This organization is a nonprofit organization.

SECTION 3

Each director serves on a volunteer basis and is not personally liable for monetary damages for negligence of the directors fiduciary duty.

ARTICLE 2 - MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1

Any person over the age of 18 may become a member of the organization by paying into the treasury the sum of \$5.00 (five dollars) per calendar year. This also includes any other organization or group (one representation) that has an interest in the promotion of agriculture. Each person or representative is entitled to one vote at the annual meeting. Payment must be made at least 30 days prior to the annual meeting. All membership dues expire January 1 of the current year.

SECTION 2

The secretary of the organization shall keep a roster of all the members and update such list annually as to new members and deaths of existing members. This list will include what township or group members are from.

SECTION 3

Members must be registered and have paid their membership fee at least 30 days in advance of the annual meeting to vote at the meeting.

ARTICLE 3

SECTION 1 - ANNUAL MEETING

The annual meeting of the Association shall be held within 120 days of the close of the annual fair.

SECTION 2

The annual meeting will be held at the place designated by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 3

Notice of the annual meeting must be published at least twice in the 30 days preceding the meeting date.

SECTION 4 - SPECIAL MEETING

Special meetings may be called by the Board of Directors by a majority vote and published the same as the annual meeting.

SECTION 5

Regular meetings will be held monthly or as called by the president of the Association.

SECTION 6

A quorum shall consist of a majority of the officers and directors.

SECTION 7

The fiscal year of the Association shall be November 1 through October 31 the following year.

ARTICLE 4

SECTION 1

The Association shall be administered by a Board of Directors; there shall be a director elected (or representative) from the following townships or groups thereof:

1. Ashland and Bridgeton Townships
2. Brooks, Croton, Big Prairie and Ensley Townships
3. Holton Township
4. Dayton Township
5. Garfield Township
6. Sheridan Township
7. Monroe, Merrill, Lilley, Home, Goodwell, Norwich and Barton Townships
8. Wilcox, Lincoln and Everett Townships
9. Sherman Township
10. Beaver, Denver and Troy Townships
11. Grant and Casnovia Townships

SECTION 2

The following group directors are appointed by their respective agencies:

1. Newaygo County Board of Commissioners
2. Newaygo County 4-H Council
3. Newaygo County Farm Bureau
4. Newaygo County Michigan Association for Family and Community Education
5. Newaygo County Soil Conservation
6. Newaygo Area Chamber of Commerce
7. Fremont Area Chamber of Commerce
8. White Cloud Chamber of Commerce
9. MSU-CES member as an ex-officio (non-voting) member

SECTION 3

In addition to the above members, the Fair Association Board may nominate up to five At-Large members. These should come from business people and other interested parties in the Fair Association. The Board may also appoint an At-Large director in the groups in Section 1 if they do not have a representative.

SECTION 4

The Fair Board also may appoint up to five teen directors (age 18 or under). These teen directors are ex-officio and non-voting. Preference for these directors should be from townships as in section 1.

SECTION 5

Directors shall be elected for a term of three years. Each year one-third of the elected directors shall be reelected. Directors are expected to attend all meetings.

SECTION 6

Any director not attending three consecutive meetings shall be contacted by the Vice President to see if they are still interested in serving on the board. The Board of Directors may appoint a member to serve the unexpired term of a director who is no longer interested or has resigned.

SECTION 7

A nominating committee shall be appointed by the Board of Directors to get a list of candidates for election to the Board. They also may be nominated from the floor at the Annual Meeting. The nominating committee shall be appointed at the regular board meeting the month before the Annual Meeting.

SECTION 8

Directors must be paid members in good standing. Payment is due on or before January 1 of the current year. Any new director will have 60 days grace period from date of appointment to the board.

ARTICLE 5

SECTION 1

The officers of the Fair Association will be elected at the next regular meeting following the Annual Meeting. Elected officers shall be members of the Board of Directors. The President and Secretary will be elected to 2-year terms on even years, and the Vice President and Treasurer will be elected to 2-year terms on odd years. The Trustee will be elected annually.

SECTION 2

Officers shall consist of the following:

- President Vice President
- Secretary Treasurer
- Trustee

SECTION 3 - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

1. PRESIDENT - The president shall preside at all the meetings of the Board. He/she shall act as the Chief Executive Officer of the Association. He/she will instruct the Secretary to call the regular meetings.
2. VICE PRESIDENT - He/she shall preside in the absence of the President, and will generally be in charge of the committees and also monitor attendance.
3. TREASURER - He/she shall receive and disburse all funds of the Association, prepare and submit to all members all financial reports required by law or requested by directors. He/she shall order supplies or equipment required for the operation of the Association and shall be the chairman of the finance committee which submits an annual budget to the Association.
4. SECRETARY - He/she shall keep all records of meetings of the members of the Board. He/she shall attend to all official correspondence of the Board, and call for Board meetings as requested by the President.
5. TRUSTEE - Attend executive meetings and preside over Board meetings in the absence of the President and/or Vice President.

SECTION 4

Officers and directors shall surrender all records and properties of the Association of their successors upon their election and qualification.

SECTION 5

The Board of Directors may appoint any additional officers that it deems necessary.

ARTICLE 6

SECTION 1 - EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive committee of the Association shall consist of all officers of the Association. The Executive Committee shall recommend to the full Board issues to come before it.

SECTION 2 - STANDING COMMITTEES

Committees of the Association shall be determined by the Board of Directors. The chairman of each committee shall be appointed annually at the same meeting as officers are elected. There shall be at least one director on every committee to represent the views of the Board and the Association.

SECTION 3

All Department Superintendents and members of standing committees shall be members of good standing of the Newaygo County Agricultural Fair Association.

ARTICLE 7

The bylaws of the Association may be amended by a two-thirds vote of those present at the Annual Meeting. To change the bylaws, it must be publicized at least 30 days prior to the Annual Meeting. All amendments to the bylaws must be certified by the President and Secretary, then filed at the office of the Michigan Department of Agriculture.

ARTICLE 8

SECTION 1

The Board of Directors, through its appointees has the power to hire any employees it deems necessary. They will also be able to enter into any type of contract, which will benefit the Association.

SECTION 2

"Robert's Rules of Order" shall be accepted as final authority in conducting the business of the Association. The constitution of the Association must at all times comply with Act 80 of the Public Act # 1855.

ARTICLE 9

SECTION 1

Should the Newaygo County Agricultural Fair Association dissolve, all remaining assets will be sold and proceeds will be donated to the Fremont Area Community Foundation.

Recommended By Law Changes

Article 2, Section # 1: Change last sentence to : All membership dues expire the day after annual meeting.

Article 2, (Membership) Section # 1: Remove: "Payment must be made at least 30 days prior to the annual meeting". This is duplicated in Sec # 3.

Article 4, Section # 2: Remove from # 9: " member as an ex-officio member"

Article 5 Section # 1: Change first sentence to: " The officers of the fair association will be elected at the annual meeting by the membership".

Article 6, Section # 2 : add at end: All standing committees shall submit a budget request by Oct 1st of each current year to the financial committee.

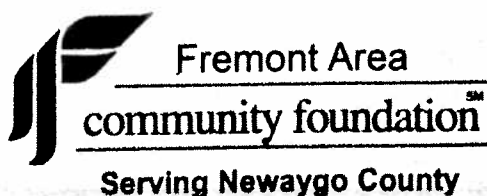

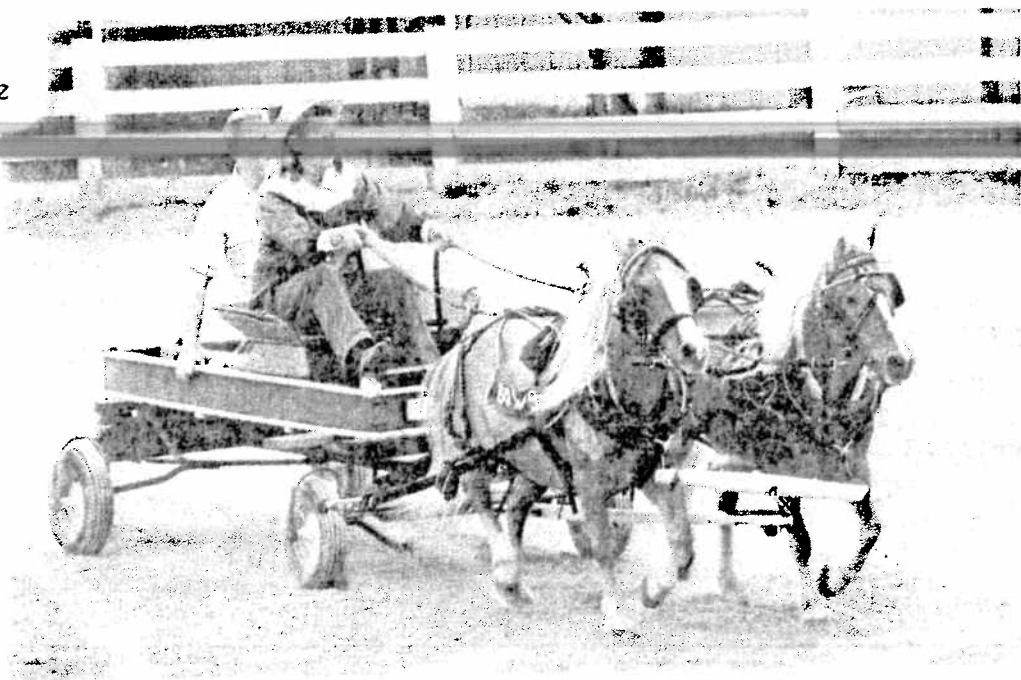

The most fun I ever had

These bighearted ponies proved size really doesn't matter. *story / ANN STRESSMAN, FREMONT, MICHIGAN*

My family thinks I'm crazy to raise horses and ponies; they refer to them as "hay-burners." But I had the last laugh—and the most fun of my life—when two of those hay-burners won us \$1,000.

My husband, Bud, and I decided to compete with our two ponies in the chuck wagon race at the Newaygo County Fair. The race is open to any horse, mule or pony team pulling a wagon with a driver and a helper.

Two teams enter and go to separate starting lines on a figure-eight track. The fun begins at the whistle, when the helpers race to pack and load camping gear—and themselves—into their wagons. Then the drivers charge out of their circles with the teams heading into the turns in opposite directions, crossing twice in the center and racing to the finish line.

Any team that loses a camping item must go back for it. A team is eliminated when a horse breaks into a canter or gallop, or when a driver touches the ground.

Our first opponents were the largest of all the teams: tall gray Percherons pulling a wagon the size of our entire trailer and truck. The crowd giggled at the sight of our Shetland-size ponies, Buttons and Bows, with me in the driver's seat and Bud as the helper.

But when we won the heat, the giggles stopped. David had beaten Goliath! We went on to conquer a Haflinger team and a mule team.

At last we entered the arena for the final race.

Facing the standardbred horses, I wondered how our ponies could possibly beat them. And I prayed our rickety old wagon would hold together for one more round.

The horn blew. Bud jumped out of our wagon and raced to the pile of items. He and the other team's man were neck and neck as they jumped back into their wagons.

Buttons and Bows headed out of the circle, making a sharp right only inches from a cone. They charged around the first turn, with the crowd on its feet, cheering for the little guys who had come so far.

I urged our ponies onward, praying Bows wouldn't canter as she took the turn where she was on the outside. She didn't! We came around the end and headed for the center, but as we crossed it the standardbreds were ahead of us and gained even more on the final turn. Buttons sped around the turn, her little hooves beating so fast they were a blur. We finished only seconds behind our opponents.

The crowd was ecstatic! Flashbulbs popped as the ponies trotted around the outside ring and we waved to the crowd.

Our second-place win earned us \$1,000. That's enough to buy an entire year's hay supply for the ponies and horses combined.

We couldn't have been happier if we'd won the Kentucky Derby. Our plucky little ponies proved that it's not always the big guy who gets the big results. 🌞

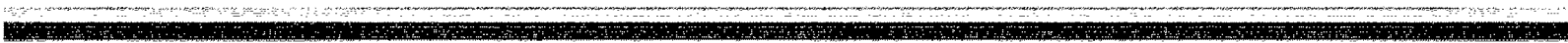

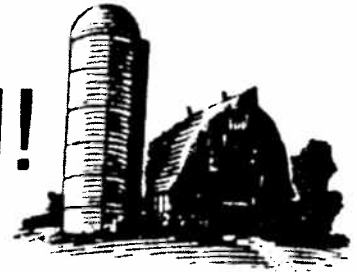
