

## YOUTH INANIMATE AUCTION RULES AND GUIDELINES

#### **FOODS – CRAFTS – ETC.**

Open to all Youth classes except Parent and Me Divisions. Auction items will be on display from 12 noon to 1:00 p.m. Auction will be held on Friday at 1:00 pm in the Show Barn.

Youth must present their item for auction.

- 1. A maximum of 2 items may be sold per exhibitor. Items must receive A or B award to be eligible to sell.
- 2. Four percent (4%) of the gross amount received for the inanimate auction item will be deducted for use of improvements in the Inanimate Auction.
- 3. Culinary Department Baked goods in keeping with proper food safety, all baked goods must be made within 24 hours of the sale. <u>All baked items must be presented in a covered and sealed container</u> for the auction to be considered as a thank you gift for the buyer. Must include complete list of ingredients
  - a. Cookies, muffins, candies 2 dozen
  - b. Pies 1 suggested to be presented for sale
  - c. Cakes 1 suggested to be presented for sale
  - d. Decorated cakes must be a real cake for the auction
  - e. Breads 1 large loaf or 2 small loaves
- 4. Canning Items In keeping with proper food safety all entries need to be properly preserved. Only jellies, and jams allowed minimum 3 jars.
- 5. **Eggs** will not be accepted in the youth inanimate auction.
- 6. Fresh Vegetables must be picked day of sale!
  - a. Beans (lima or snap), Peas, Cherry Tomatoes 1 gallon bag
  - b. Beets, Tomatoes (except Cherry), Turnips, Peppers (sweet or hot), Onions (yellow, white or red) 5
  - c. Broccoli 3 bunches minimum
  - d. Cabbage, Lettuce, and Cauliflower 1 head
  - e. Carrots, Radishes 1 dozen minimum
  - f. Celery 1 plant
  - g. Corn 1 dozen ears
  - h. Zucchini, Squash (summer and winter), Eggplant, Cucumbers (pickling or slicing) 5 minimum
  - i. Green Onions 1 large bunch
  - j. Rhubarb 1/2 dozen stalks minimum
  - k. Gourds 3
  - l. Melons Muskmelon, Watermelon, and Pumpkins 1
  - m. Potatoes 1 dozen minimum
- 7. Herbs all varieties 1 or more bunches
  - a. Individual flowers 6 stems minimum
  - b. Fresh Arrangements and Bouquets
  - c. Dried Arrangements
  - d. Unusual Container arrangement, garden in glass, corsage (fresh or dried)
- 8. Honey
- 9. Field Crops
  - a. Wheat, Rye, Oats, Barley, Shelled Corn, and Soy Beans 1 peck or more
  - b. Hay 1 bale
  - c. Dry Beans and Clover Seed 1 quart or more
- 10. Arts and Crafts to include horticultural crafts, sewing and needlework, arts crafts and hobbies, photography and farm arts
  - a. Arts and Crafts items made with <u>perishable items such as fresh flowers and veggies a duplicate of the exhibited item must be made</u>. All others have the option of either making a duplicate or selling the one being exhibited.
  - b. Photography photo must be 5 x 7 or larger matted frame.
- 11. All exhibitors who enter to participate in the auction <u>MUST CHECK-IN</u> with the Auction Committee during Friday/Saturday inanimate project intake to be eligible sell.
- 12. Clubs are eligible to sell 2 items at the auction as a club fundraiser. All the same rules and guidelines will apply, and price at the sale will be subject to a 4% deduction.
